
Sew from the outside to the inside on the 3rd station, coming back out through the last (4th) station, leaving




Sew the first gathering from the outside to the inside through the 1st hole, or station.

,

At the end of the 3rd gathering, secure with a kettle stitch. Push the needle between the 1st and 2nd signatures and to the right of the final station thread.




- $\begin{tabular}{ll} 14 & {\it Pull the thread through in the sewing direction to } \\ & {\it create a small loop.} \end{tabular}$
- Pass the needle through the loop from underneath and pull to tighten.



Folding and Sewing a Quarto

IN EIGHT'S WITH THREE GATHERINGS

1 Fold one sheet twice to make a quarto.




Repeat until you have 6 quartos.




Repeat for all gatherings, making sure the holes line up throughout.





Punch an even number of holes along the gutter of all your gatherings.






Nest 2 quartos to form a gathering, or quire. This is called a quarto in eight's.

In between the 3rd and 2nd stations, loop the sewing under the exposed thread segment from the first gathering. At the end of the 1st station, tie a square knot with the tail thread of the 1st gathering.







